How to determine if you are a Small Business

NAICS Codes - What is your NAICS Code?

SBA Definition of a Small Business

Define in 1 of 2 ways...

1

Average Number of Employees over the past 12 months.

2

Average Annual Receipts over the past three years.

A Small Business concern...

- Is organized for profit.
- Has a place of business in the U.S.
- Operates primarily within the U.S.

-or-

makes a significant contribution to the U.S. economy through payment of taxes or use of American products, materials or labor.

- Independently owned and operated.
- Not dominant in its field on a national basis.

Definition will vary to reflect industry differences, such as size standards.

Size Standards

All federal agencies must use **SBA Size Standards** for contracts identified as Small Business.

Established in the Code Of Federal Regulations, Part 121 (13 CFR Part 121) Small Business Size Regulations.

A Small Business size standard is numerical and represents the largest a concern can be and still be considered a Small Business for Federal Government programs.

Example: Size standard for NAICS Code 238910 Site Preparation Contractors is \$16.5M average revenue over the most recent 3 years.

- Only counts 1st tier subcontractors as of now

- Single reporting system eSRS
- Included in Contractor Performance and Reporting System (CPARS)

Next NGA West Specific Contracting Notes

This is a federal contract that follows Federal Acquisition Requirements, Department of Defense, Army, Corps of Engineers and NGA rules and regulations, and has different requirements than state and private commercial contracts.

The US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) is competing and awarding a Design-Build (D-B) Construction Contract, and up to 5 separate Small Business Construction Contracts.



Next NGA West Specific Contracting Notes

Secure construction for intelligence facilities requires:

- All personnel working on site subject to local and/or national agency background checks
- All workers issued badges that enable ID and electronic checking in and out of the site
- Computer, phone and camera use on site limited to approved individuals and devices
- After completion security clearances or escorts for may be required

Equal Employment Opportunity

Requirements to be eligible as a Prime Contractor – important for Sub-Contracting Opportunities

- System for Award Management <u>www.SAM.gov</u>
- Free registration required to contract with the Federal Government
- Gathers basic information to ensure eligibility for award
- D-U-N-S Number <u>www.dnb.com/get-a-duns-number.html</u>
- A Unique identification number for businesses.
- Recommend vendors register with Dun & Bradstreet for a DUNS BEFORE starting the SAM.gov registration process.
- NAICS code <u>www.census.gov/eos/www/naics/index.html</u>
- North American Industry Classification System
- The type of work your company primarily performs.
- Search the website by key word to find your industry NAICS code.


